Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In our readings today, we hear about the isolation of those with leprosy. That they must declare themselves unclean and live apart from society. It's lonely living by yourself, especially when you think the time alone is because no one wants to go near vou. When the leper comes before Jesus and says, "if you wish, you can a plea: if you wish, you can love me, if made clean." Our messes never go *vou wish, invite me in.* While some translations say Jesus was moved with discomfort, family issues, identity pity, others say "moved with compassion." And he responds "I do will it. Be made clean." I do will it. I love you. I do will it. You are welcome here.

What does it mean to be made "clean" by the spirit? What does it mean to bring our messes to God?

For today, I'll posit that it means accepting the love of God given to us for exactly who we are and showing it to move you to love others in the to others, because the spirit wills it. God wants it. We are desired in love and given opportunities in the messiness of our humanity to love. We might find the process of being made clean akin to healing, but in order to do that we have to be vulnerable. We have to enter into relationship, we have to allow God's grace to flow

freely, and we have to search to see it. When the leper approaches and kneels before Jesus, it's a moment of reckoning. I envision myself in the body of the leper, crying out to Jesus: help me, love me, welcome me.

Regardless of the human ailments we might experience, God is there to say: make me clean," it almost sounds like "I do will it, I love you. I do will it. Be away. We all carry anxiety, trauma, crises, pain, and sorrow in every action of our lives. Since thinking through the ideas from the readings today, I've found new comfort in the commonly printed phrase, bless this mess!

> As we approach the season of Lent, how will you ask God to bless your mess? How will you allow yourself to feel the love of Jesus as he prepares to suffer? How will you allow the spirit midst of their messes? How will you bring yourself before God to be made clean?

The African Americans' view of the sacred and divine is inextricably linked to their African heritage, their inherent values of freedom, justice, and racial equality, and their early experiences in the U.S. Although many blacks voluntarily embraced Christianity, some whites used selected biblical teachings of obedience and suffering to keep the slaves submissive. Despite this blacks adopted the salvation story as their own and were quick to accept the freedom it offered. Consequently, their music, dance, prayer and secret gatherings reflected the theme of freedom. They strongly identified with the suffering of Jesus and held the hope that one day Jesus' message of Jubilee—his proclamation of freedom from oppression—would eventually be realized. This faith lies at the heart of the African American experience. What African Americans needed was not just freedom from servitude, but the freedom to make their own choices, to attain their full potential, and to knock on the doors of justice and be let in.
