### **Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

"Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me. Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it" (Matthew 10:37-42).

These verses, where Jesus asks his to follow him, can seem challenging. And, for many who are deconstructing from harmful and manipulative religious traditions, they may seem to offer a template for spiritual abuse. and found no help from fellow Christians who just told them "Jesus wants are struggling because their doctor told them another pregnancy could kill them, and have been told they have to "take up the cross" of potentially dying, before considering options for preventing pregnancy. 
